

Statute of Green Legacy Hiroshima Initiative Committee

(Name)

Article 1 The Committee is named Green Legacy Hiroshima Initiative

(Objectives)

Article 2 The objective of the Green Legacy Hiroshima Initiative (hereafter 'The Committee') is to safeguard and spread the meaning and knowledge of the existence of Hiroshima's A-bombed trees, by planting their seeds and saplings worldwide in partnership with a dedicated global community.

(Activities)

Article 3 The Committee conducts the following activities, in order to achieve the objectives listed in the preceding article:

- 1) Distribution of seeds and saplings of Hiroshima's A-bombed trees worldwide;
- 2) Outreach activities for Hiroshima's A-bombed trees and their peace message;
- 3) Other activities in line with its objectives.

(Committee Members)

Article 4 The Committee includes the following members.

1) Co-Founders/Coordinator	2
2) Research and other staff	3
3) Auditors	1

(Governance)

Article 5 The overall direction and the day-to-day operations of the Committee are determined by the Co-Founders/Coordinators, with the assistance of the Working Group as well as other partners and advisors, in Hiroshima and worldwide. The Co-Founders/Coordinators convene all meetings of the Committee and Working Group

(Partners and Working Group)

Article 6 The Committee is assisted in the implementation of its objectives by its two institutional partners, UNITAR and ANT-Hiroshima, as well as by a Working Group, representing Hiroshima Peace Culture Foundation, Hiroshima Botanical Garden, Hiroshima City, Hiroshima Prefecture as well as Hiroshima University. A full Working Group meeting will be convened at least four times a year. The Committee will also seek and establish other international partnerships for the conduct of its worldwide activities.

(Financial Matters)

Article 7 The Committee is not-for-profit and the costs of its activities will be covered by public and private donations. The fiscal year starts on July 1 and ends on June 30 every year. A Statement of Accounts will be prepared as part of the Activity Report of each fiscal year.

(Headquarters and Secretariat)

Article 8 The Committee is headquartered in Hiroshima, Japan and a Secretariat is established to assist in the conduct of its activities at the following: Aki-Legal Bldg. 2F, 8-14 Kami-Hatchobori, Naka-ku, Hiroshima, Japan.

(Establishment Date)

Article 9 The Committee is established on July 1, 2012.

Additional clause

This Statute is effective as of July 1, 2012.
