

Dr. Milton Chen

Co-founder & CEO, Vsee

Dr. Milton Chen is CEO and cofounder of VSee telehealth, the no code, low code tech stack used by McKesson, GE, Optum, DaVita, and NASA Space Station. Dr. Chen completed his PhD research at Stanford on the psychology of the elements of trust over video communications, and also wrote the first version of VSee there. Dr. Chen has given hundreds of invited talks including keynotes at Arab Health and Health 2.0. He has also deployed VSee for celebrities and world leaders such as Hillary Clinton, Angelina Jolie, Ban Kimoon, and former President Obama's Inauguration.



Dr. Annalicia Pickering

Dr. Annalicia Pickering is a physician on faculty at Stanford University. She has practiced medicine in several countries and has additional experience in global health policy as well as medical education. Mr. Alexander Mejia. Director, Division for People and Social Inclusion. UNITAR: Mr. Alexander Mejia has been a senior international civil servant at the United Nations Institute for Training and Research (UNITAR) since 2004. He currently serves as the Director of UNITAR's Division for People and Social Inclusion in Geneva. He has previously held positions as the Director of UNITAR's Hiroshima Office in Japan and the CIFAL training centre in Atlanta, USA. Additionally, Mr. Mejia oversees UNITAR's global network of CIFAL training centres and is responsible for the Nigeria Project Office. With a career spanning three decades, Mr. Mejia has worked in private and public organisations. He started in corporate banking in Latin America and later joined Ecuador's foreign service as a diplomat. He served as Vice Minister of Economy for Ecuador and represented the country in various international institutions. Mr. Mejia holds master's degrees in international relations and business administration, as well as a bachelor's degree in agronomy. He is a recipient of Ecuador's highest decoration, the National Order of Merit.

Dr. Jarone Lee, MD, MPH is co-founder of Health Tech Without Borders, Inc., a global nonprofit organization aiming to mitigate humanitarian disasters by leveraging digital tools and technology to provide immediate access to health resources. Dr. Lee is an Associate Professor at Harvard Medical School and the Vice Chief of Critical Care for the Division of Trauma, Emergency Surgery, Surgical Critical Care at Massachusetts General Hospital. He regularly deploys to support federal disaster response as a Medical Officer for MA-1 Disaster Medical Assistance Team (DMAT) within the National Disaster Medical System (NDMS). Boston Foundation and Get Konnected named him one of Boston's most influential AAPI leaders in 2023

Marianna Petrea-Imenokhoeva is a Digital Health expert with over 25 years of experience in the tech industry. She co-founded Health Tech Without Borders, a global non-profit organization dedicated to mitigating healthcare crises by leveraging digital tools and technology to provide immediate access to health resources. Marianna excels in emergency deployments for various types of disasters, with core expertise in Telehealth, Al/ML, and Big Data. She is skilled in building international, multi-disciplinary, and multi-cultural teams, as well as proficient in investigating, allocating, and utilizing different types of resources. She possesses practical skills in rapidly implementing Digital Health solutions in disaster areas and humanitarian crises.



Eva Skinner-Regel

Clinical Director, Health Tech Without Borders - Clinical ethicist at Massachusetts General Hospital in Boston, Massachusetts.

Eva Skinner-Regel is a Clinical Director at Health Tech Without Borders, leading Helping Healers Heal, a program aimed at mental health support for healthcare providers in humanitarian disaster zones. Eva is also a clinical ethicist at Massachusetts General Hospital in Boston, Massachusetts, where she performs ethics consultations for adult patients, their families, and healthcare teams, conducts research, writes on issues in clinical ethics, and leads and participates in medical staff debriefings, support, and education. Eva's research interests include humanitarian ethics, including research in moral distress and moral injury in humanitarian work and disaster mental health. Her clinical skills in mental health include crisis interventions, trauma interventions (physical and psychosocial trauma, including childhood abuse/neglect), acute and post-traumatic stress, death and dying, adjustment to illness, anxiety, and depression. Eva is currently pursuing a doctoral degree in Bioethics at Loyola University Chicago. Eva received her Master's Degree in Bioethics from Harvard Medical School, a Master's Degree in Clinical Social Work from Boston College, and a Master's Degree in Economics from Houston University, where she conducted research on determining predictive factors for a currency crisis
