Thematic Areas in spotlight



Strengthening youth-led conflict transformation and reconciliation

Some examples of UNITAR's work in this area include support to the Mwalimu Nyerere Foundation in the realization of a Pan-African Youth Fellowship, aimed at promoting youth leadership and peacebuilding skills across the African continent. Further, UNITAR is supporting young persons in Libya to lead dialogue processes on reconciliation within their communities, in close collaboration with a network of Libyan civil society organizations. Similarly, UNITAR continues to support the Colombian peace process, across the themes of reintegration of children and youth, youth-led conflict transformation and communitybased reconciliation. Programming in all three cases is led by local partners, methodologies are needs-based and transformative, and while being youth-led and youth focused, also includes youth allies and counterparts.



Enabling changemaking through digital solutions

In the spirit of leaving no one behind, UNITAR has redoubled its efforts to make youth empowerment opportunities more accessible and inclusive through providing free and openly accessible digital solutions. One example is UNITAR's digital course Explore Your Changemaker Potential, available in all UN languages and Portuguese, on the popular learning platform EdApp. This tool for young peacebuilders recognises that trainings can go beyond pure skills building. It shows that it is possible to use participants' pre-existing motivations, ideals, and inner capacities to meaningfully contribute to their communities most pressing needs. It, among many other tools, helps young people achieve their potential for changemaking and to contribute directly to the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals.



Paving the way for young social and business entrepreneurs

The diverse youth demographics of today represent the largest and most active segments of the global population. Yet, many young persons grow up in poverty and lack adequate support to realise their aspirations and to contribute to flourishing social and employment sectors. Often, these dynamics of exclusion are additionally intersected with existing conflict dynamics. By providing dedicated programming jointly with local partner, such as through the E-Mobility for Kenya project, UNITAR helps improve equitable access to the labour market while supporting young persons establish important strategies to contribute to sustainable growth, help advance youthfriendly attitudes to entrepreneurship, and to prevent latent conflict at many levels.

Youth-Leadership

UNITAR recognizes the unique capacity of young people to lead transformative action for the achievement of peaceful, just and inclusive societies. We therefore support organizations, networks and individuals in elevating capacities for youth leadership at all levels.

Youth agency and changemaking
